 - családi kapcsolatok kifejezésére.
He's got two brothers. Két bátyja van.
 - emberek, állatok jellemzésére.
Mary has got fair hair. Marynek világos haja van.

- Birtoklás kifejezésére használjuk.

Egyes számú főnevek 's végződést kapnak.	This is the girl's bag. Ez a lány táskája. This is Tom's car. Ez Tom autója.
Nem rendhagyó többes számú főnevek végére: ' kerül	That's my parents' house. Az a szüleim háza.
Rendhagyó többesszámú főnevek után 's áll.	Here's the children's room. Itt van a gyerekek szobája.
Ha két vagy több személy birtokol egy valamit, a második név után kerül az 's	This is Louise and Kev's flat. Ez Luise és Kev lakása.
Ha két vagy több személy birtokol több dolgot, akkor az 's mindkét személy neve után áll.	These are Bob's and Rick's bikes. Ezek Rob és Rick biciklijei.

FONTOS

Ha nem személy, hanem tárgy vagy fogalom birtokol valamit, akkor of+főnév szerkezetet használunk a birtoklás kifejezésére, és a szórend is módosul.
The windows of this house are very big. Ennek a háznak az ablakai nagyon nagyok.

I watch TV every day. Minden nap TV-t nézek.
She goes out at the weekend. Minden hétvégén elmegy szórakozni.
- általános cselekvések, állapotok kifejezésére.
We live in Boston. Bostonban élünk.
I like ice cream. Szeretem a fagyalaltot.
- napirend, órarend, menetrend esetén.
She starts work at 8.30 every day. Minden nap 8.30-kor kezd.

A folyamatos és egyszerű jelen igeidő

- A **folyamatos jelen** igeidőt a beszéd pillanatában éppen történő cselekvések kifejezésére használjuk.
John is watching TV now. John épp tévét néz.
Listen! She is playing the piano. Hallgasd csak! Zongorázik.
- Az **egyszerű jelen** igeidőt szokásos, ismétlődő cselekvések és állapotok kifejezésére használjuk.
John watches TV at the weekend. John hétvégén tévét szokott nézni.
He plays the piano every day. Minden nap zongorázik.

Tetszés kifejezése

- A **like, love** és **enjoy** igéket tetszés kifejezésére használjuk. Főnév vagy -ing végződésű ige követi ezeket.
I like reading books in my free time. Szeretek könyvet olvasni a szabadidőmben.
I love talk shows on TV. Szeretem a beszélgetős műsorokat.
I enjoy watching talent shows. Szeretek tehetségkutató műsorokat nézni.
- Nemtetszést a **dislike, hate** and **can't stand** igékkel fejezhetünk ki, szintén főnév vagy -ing végződés követi ezeket az igéket.
I dislike talk shows. Nem szeretem a beszélgetős műsorokat.
I hate watching the news. Utálok híreket nézni.
I can't stand sitcoms. Ki nem állhatom a sitcomokat.

Az egyszerű múlt igeidőt használjuk:

- meghatározott múlt időben történt cselekvések, történések kifejezésére.
We bought our house five years ago. 5 éve vettük a házunkat.
- Múlt idejű szokásos és ismétlődő cselekvések kifejezésére.
I always went to bed early when I lived with my parents. Mikor a szüleimmel éltem, mindig korán fektüdtem le aludni.
- Egymás után történt múlt idejű cselekvések esetén (pl. felsorolás)
Yesterday I got up at 8.00, had breakfast and left for school. Tegnap 8-kor felkeltem, megreggeliztem és elmentem az iskolába.

A **Could** segédige a **can** múlt idejű alakja. Múlt idejű képesség kifejezésére használjuk.

My sister couldn't swim when she was seven. A testvérem nem tudott úszni, mikor hét éves volt.

Melléknévből képzett határozók

Melléknévből a "Hogyan?" kérdésre válaszoló határozókat képezhetünk.

Stan is a good driver. He drives **carefully**. Stan jó sofőr. Ő jól vezet.

Legtöbb esetben a melléknév végére -ly kerül	quiet -> quietly careful -> carefully
Ha a melléknév mássalhangzó+y-ra végződik, akkor az y i-re változik.	easy -> easily
-le végződésű melléknévek esetén az e elmarad.	terrible -> terribly

- A **must** és **have to/has to** segédigék jelen és jövő idejű kötelességet fejeznek ki.

- A **mustn't** tiltást jelent.
You mustn't be late again! Tilos újra elkésned!
- A **don't/doesn't have to** jelentése: nem kell.
You don't have to come early tomorrow. It isn't necessary. Nem kell holnap korán jönnöd. Nincs rá szükség.

FONTOS

Múlt idejű kötelességre vagy annak hiányára (kell, nem kell) a **had to** segédigét használjuk, tehát a **must** nem jelölhet múlt időt.

A melléknevek közép- és felsőfoka

- Amikor összehasonlítunk két tárgyat, embert, fogalmat egymással, a mellékneveket fokozzuk, közép vagy felsőfokot használva.

Mindegyik egy szótagú, és a legtöbb két szótagú melléknév esetén az -er és -est képzőt használjuk:	clean -> cleaner -> the cleanest quiet -> quieter -> the quietest
Amikor -e betűre végződik a melléknév, nem írunk még egyet:	nice -> nicer -> the nicest
Egy szótagú melléknevek esetében, ha egy magánhangzó+egy mássalhangzóra végződnek, akkor az utolsó mássalhangzó megkettőződik.	hot -> hotter -> the hottest
Mássalhangzó +y-ra végződő melléknevek esetében az y helyett: ier/-iest	easy -> easier -> the easiest
Három vagy több szótagú melléknevek esetében a fokozás a more + melléknév / most + melléknév képzéssel történik:	expensive -> more expensive -> the most expensive careful -> more careful -> the most careful

Debbie's as tall as her brother. Debby ugyanolyan magas, mint a bátyja.
- not as + melléknév + as
Geography isn't as interesting as history. A földrajz nem ugyanolyan érdekes, mint a történelem.
